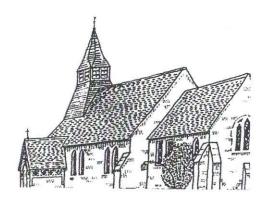

3. Constitutional Matters.

The parish is in the Pershore & Evesham Deanery in the Diocese of Worcester, and together with five other parishes constitutes the Bowbrook Benefice. There are two churches, St James, Church Lane, Oddingley, Droitwich Spa, WR9 7NE and St Peter ad Vincula, Church Lane, Tibberton, Droitwich Spa, WR9 7NW. The PCC is a charity but is currently excepted from registration with the Charity Commission because its annual income is less than £100,000. Members of the PCC are management trustees as defined by the Charities Act 2011. This Act and the associated regulations, The Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 (together "Regulations"), require the PCC to prepare accounts to 31 December each year which give a true and fair view of the financial position at the end of the financial year and of the financial activities for the year. The PCC is of the opinion that in preparing the accounts to 31 December 2023 appropriate accounting policies have been consistently applied, supported by reasonable and prudent estimates and judgements and all applicable accounting standards have been followed. The PCC is also satisfied that it has adequate resources to meet its needs for the foreseeable future and accordingly it continues to adopt the "going concern" basis in preparing the accounts.

The PCC is also responsible for ensuring that accounting records are kept which disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the PCC and which enable it to ensure that the accounts comply with the Charities Act and Regulations. It is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the parish and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Members of the PCC are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in accordance with the Church Representation Rules as contained in Schedule 3 of the Synodical Government Measure 1969 (as amended).

All members on the church electoral roll are entitled to vote and to stand for election to the PCC. Additional members can be co-opted and the incumbent is ex-officio a member. The functions and powers of the PCC are contained in the Parochial Church Council (Powers) Measure 1956 as amended by the 1969 Measure. The PCC, as a legal minimum, is responsible for:

- the financial management of the parish
- A the care and maintenance of the churches' fabric and churchyards
- A the appointment of trustees to any separate trusts connected with the parish.

So that they can discharge these responsibilities power has been conferred on the PCC to enable it, if appropriate, to:

- A acquire, manage and administer property for ecclesiastical purposes affecting the parish
- A formulate and approve an annual budget for the maintenance of the churches' work
- levy and collect a voluntary church rate
- A make representations to the Bishop with regard to matters affecting the welfare of the parish and its inhabitants.

The Standing Committee is the only committee of the PCC required by law. It has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the PCC.

ANNUAL REPORT - 2023

1. Objectives and Activities

Our purpose is the manifestation of our shared Christian faith characterised by:

- services of public worship
- A maintaining a relevant and viable church
- A a programme of social events
- welcoming and supporting those coming to us for Baptisms, Marriages and Funerals
- keeping our churches always open for private solitude, prayer and relaxation
- engaging with the local community
- working within the Bowbrook Benefice and the wider Church
- giving financial and other support to carefully selected charities.

The church is important to people living in the area and seeks to serve the community. Details of church activities can be found in the Bowbrook News magazine, on the churches' websites, (www.oddingleychurch.org and www.tibbertonchurch.org), on church and village notice boards and are distributed by email.

2. Achievements and Performance

The two churches continue to be managed largely by their Local Church Councils (LCC's) subject to supervision by the PCC. The LCCs give a report to the PCC at its meetings and a copy of the minutes of LCC meetings is entered into the PCC Minutes Book.

The PCC has complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 i.e. the duty to have due regard to the House of Bishops' guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults.

For some time it has been difficult to recruit people willing to be on the PCC and increasingly hard to fill administrative posts. 2023 has proved to be a particularly challenging year. The only regular meeting of the Council was held on 24^{th} January 2023 at Tibberton Old Village Halll which was still in use despite the New Hall having been built.

The Annual Parochial Church Meeting (APCM) was also held in Tibberton Old Village Hall but was attended by only four members; enough to form a quorum. Agreement had been obtained in advance, from members unable to attend, to be elected or appointed to posts as appropriate. An Annual Report had not been completed. Toby Thornes was elected to serve another year as Lay Chairman, John Gearey as Treasurer and Lynne Morton as Secretary.

On 26th March an Announcement from the Bishop was read out in churches in the Benefice, to say that Rev'd David Morris had been appointed to be Priest-in-Charge of a new Group of parishes and would be leaving us. A "leaving service" was held on 25th June at Himbleton; David's last working day with us was 9th July and then we were in Interregnum! Inevitably, it was not possible to continue with the same pattern of services as before and it was agreed that Tibberton and Oddingley should alternate services hoping that members of the congregations would attend the other church when theirs had no service. This happened to a certain extent and those who did enjoyed a new closeness with the other church and its members. Services were covered by a band of visiting clergy and Lay ministers who came forward and gave us great support through a difficult time. Helen Volak the Group Administrator worked very hard to make sure that no one missed out.

Representatives from the parish joined a Steering Committee to deal with the advertising for a replacement and overseeing the Interviewing process. A representative from each church in the Benefice made up the Interview Panel. A considerable amount of time and effort was required to produce parish profiles to accompany the advertisement under the guidance of the Archdeacon and Area Dean. We were very pleased when another Bishop's Announcement came on 26th November telling us that Rev'd Richard Sandland had

been appointed as our new Rector and would be joining us early the next year.

With so few members, there has been little social or fundraising activity in Oddingley, but Tibberton has held a range of successful events and especially, has involved the School pupils and parents as much as possible in the life of the Church and vice versa. A PCC member is a Foundation Governor of the school and works hard to keep the connections alive. This adds to an important relationship between the Church and the local community. Monthly "nights out", usually at The Bridge in Tibberton, open to all, have continued and regular "Drop-ins" still take place.

Reports from the LCCs on the individual churches are as follows:-

St Peter ad Vincula, Tibberton 2023

The Church routine and worship during this year was severely disrupted by the unexpected departure of our vicar at the end of June. The TLCC worked hard to maintain a normal pattern of services and in this they were helped and supported by other clergy, lay readers and the incredible endeavours of Helen Volak in the Bowbrook Office. The TLCC has continued to divide the wide ranging tasks necessary for the smooth running of the church between them and worked hard to achieve this, often unseen, with limited resources.

On 27th February there was a memorial service and interment of ashes for Sheila Morris. Her daughter Helen and a team of helpers decorated the Church to reflect every aspect of Sheila's life. The Church has never looked so beautiful. There have also been services for the burial of Nick Priddey on 27th October and for the interment of ashes of Audrey Couch in June and Margaret Gray in July. On July 9th we celebrated the baptism of Thanh Le followed by her marriage to Lee Creaser.

The relationship between Tibberton CofE First School and the church continues to strengthen and grow with clergy and members of the LCC actively involved in curriculum planning, weekly 'Open the Book' assemblies and church visits. This valued connection was maintained during the interregnum. The Coronation weekend involved a procession of children through the village to the church, wearing the crowns they had made, followed by a special service, which was well attended and much enjoyed by all.

The repairs to the Church structure which commenced last year were completed, meaning that the walls of the Church and the graveyard are now sound and aesthetically pleasing; the rose window is now restored to its full glory, and the builder installed a new path and refurbished the entrance to the churchyard on the north side as thanks for our prayers for his son during his long, debilitating battle with cancer. In January the timer for the heating broke and was replaced by a new digital one at a cost of £289. The porch continues to be in a perilous condition and talks continue regarding the possibility of installing a toilet.

A Hunger Lunch was held on the 12^{th} March in the Old Parish Hall, the £416 raised being donated to the DEC appeals for Ukraine and the Turkey and Syria earthquake victims. The Christmas Draw this year made a profit of £763 for Church funds and the £108 collected at the Carol Singing with mulled wine at the Village Hall was shared equally between the Church and the Maggs Day Centre.

Services and Ministry

The year began with our usual pattern of weekly worship in place. Rev'd David Morris took most of our services of Holy Communion, while others were taken by Rev'd Sue Pollard, the associate priest supporting David, or Rev'd Dick Johnson whose ministry is Faith in the Workplace. Bill Sumner, authorised Lay Minister, regularly led our Evensong on the third Sunday of each month and services of Matins were led occasionally by Toby Thornes when he was home from his studies, or by Rev'd David Morris or visiting clergy who kindly stepped in to help out in the Benefice. Among these were Lay Minister James Homer who was ordained in the Cathedral on 24th September. We are grateful to all of these for their care and support. In March we learned that Rev'd David Morris was appointed to a new Group of Parishes and so would be

leaving us! His last Service with us was on the 2ndJuly. On 26th November we were delighted to hear the Bishop's Announcement that Rev'd Richard Sandland had been appointed to be our new Rector and we were pleased to know that he would be joining us in the new year. Inevitably, entering Interregnum involved a reduction in the number of services possible and it was decided that we should share some with Tibberton, rather than each of us having a service every week. The movement between the two churches has been a good experience, despite only a few from each congregation wishing to "commute" on a regular basis. Those of us who have done so feel that it has brought the Parish together in a beneficial way and enriched our Worship.

A huge vote of thanks is due to Helen Volak, the Benefice Administrator, who worked very hard to recruit clergy to take services and we have valued the input of a range of visiting priests, including the Archdeacons and retired ministers.

We have been grateful to Des George who has continued to play the Organ for us.

Fabric and Maintenance

There are some issues raised in the Quinquennial Inspection May 2021 which still need to be addressed but Church and Churchyard are in generally good order.

In March one of the dehumidifiers, placed in the Chancel, was repaired and a new, larger model installed opposite to the door to replace the other old one which had failed. This works on a timer and comes on during the night.

In January drains and gutters were cleared and a tree in the lower Churchyard was reduced in size by a tree surgeon at the request of neighbours who felt that it was causing too much shade over their property.

The hedges have been cut and the churchyard mown regularly. In October a large amount of waste which had accumulated beside the compost bay was cleared away and the area tidied up. Wildflower seeds were sown in the cleared space.

Congregation, Social events and Fundraising

Sadly our numbers have decreased and there are fewer of us to do the usual jobs. In the March issue of the Bowbrook News there was an appeal for more volunteers but with no success. The year began with two Churchwardens in post but in February one of them, Gayle May, moved away with her husband, Bob, to be near their daughters in Leeds. We wished them well and thanked them for all that they had contributed to the Church over many years but have missed both very much. We received the sad news that Bob died at his new home in Leeds on 24th October.

A small group form the Oddingley Local Church Council (OLCC) which meets to consider church matters and make reports and recommendations to the PCC.

It has not been possible to maintain any fundraising or social events with so few people available to help. There had been an intention to resume our usual Jumble Sale, held twice yearly at the Old Library, Droitwich but cancelled during the Pandemic, but it was not possible to do so.

Ride and Stride, the annual sponsored event in support of The Historic Churches Trust, took place in September and St James was open all day with refreshments on offer but the numbers participating were very few this year.

A more positive thought is that we had good numbers attending our Carol Service and we have many regular returning visitors to the church who leave appreciative messages in the Visitors' Book and donations in the wall safe. We have also, on occasions, been joined at services by holiday makers on the canal.

3. Electoral roll and usual Sunday attendance

The number on the electoral roll reported to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 24th May 2023 was 55, a decrease of 3.

4. Finance

Despite the interregnum during the second half of the year and the reduction in the number of services as a consequence, the impact on total income of the parish was a small increase of £2,000. There were 4 factors contributing to this: a reduction in regular gift aid income and the associated tax refund of £1,000 and the non-repeat of a legacy of £5,000 in Oddingley offset by a legacy and grants in Tibberton of £5,000. This decrease was offset by £3,000 more income from our investments as a result of the rises in interest rates that started mid-year.

On the expenditure side the main difference from 2022 was the £33,000 spent on major repairs to Tibberton, but there was a reduction of £3,000 in Ministry Share.

Our investments recovered 70% of the value they lost in 2022, but to a certain extent this is academic as we are not expecting to need to realise any of them in the foreseeable future.

At the year end, our total funds carried forward into 2024 were:

In looking at these numbers, it is the General Funds which enable us to pay our bills, and the continuing decline, whilst not critical at the moment, is a concern. In simple terms, the reduction each year is the measure of the shortfall in our income to meet our bills. This is largely a problem for Oddingley caused partly by the significant number of members lost since before the pandemic. The scope for economies is limited because most of our costs are fixed, i.e. they do not vary in line with membership or Sunday attendance, and the scope to increase income is restricted by the number of regular members and the human resources to organise fund raising and similar events. The average Sunday attendance at Oddingley (above) is misleading as it is the product of high numbers at special services, but an average of only 8 or less on other Sundays. Tibberton's income does more or less cover its basic costs. The realignment of Ministry Share will help but until our average Sunday attendance rises to 12 to 15 in both churches we will be unlikely to have an income sufficient to cover our costs.

5. Reserves

The PCC considers it prudent to have reserves equivalent to six months' expenditure plus, this year, the estimated amount required to carry out the maintenance advised in the Quinquennial Inspection Reports (QI) and a margin of £5,000. i.e. £85,000. Our free reserves amounted to £129,354, so we have adequate reserves.

6. Conclusion

The year 2023 has been a challenging one and brought us some sad losses and problems to solve but also brighter moments and successes. Although we may feel at times that our resources are stretched and our energy lacking the presence of a new King and a new Rector must keep our hopes alive! Our vision for the parish includes the aspiration to be a 'relevant and viable Church' within the communities which we serve. We have regular opportunities to address this when families come to us to celebrate precious moments in their lives; baptisms and weddings and when they entrust to us the memories and final care of loved ones; surely a unique privilege.

We pray that we can remain steadfast in our conviction that God is with us in all the twists and turns of life and maintain our faith in Him to guide us through the coming year.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Hadzor with Oddingley and Tibberton Parochial Church Council (PCC)

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Hadzor with Oddingley and Tibberton Parochial Church Council (the Trust) for the year ended 31 December 2023 set out on the following 24 pages and comprising Statements of Financial Activities and Balances Sheets for the individual congregations of Oddingley and Tibberton and combined for the parish as a whole.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act).

I report in respect of my examination of the Trust's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS - 31 December 2023

1 Accounting policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 and the Church Accounting Regulations 2006, together with applicable accounting standards and with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, using the accruals basis; that is, with the exception noted in (b) below, income and expenditure is brought into account in the period to which it relates which is not necessarily the same period in which it is received or paid.

In order to give a complete picture of the affairs of the parish these accounts include the transactions, assets and liabilities representing our share of Bowbrook Group and Bowbrook News.

(b) Income

With the exception of gift aid tax recoverable, which is accrued, income is only brought into account when it is received and recorded or legal title exists. For fund raising events the proceeds are accounted for gross with any associated costs being shown separately (if material).

(c) Missionary and charitable giving

Donations are made to other charities of a percentage of the gross income of the General fund and they are accounted for at the earlier of the time of payment or when awarded.

(d) Tangible fixed assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by sections 10 (2) (a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's Inventory which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to 1 January Movable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for their disposal, are accounted as inalienable 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore, such assets are not valued in the financial statements. Items acquired since 1 January 2000 and costing more than £1,000 are capitalised.

Other land and buildings, fixtures, fittings and equipment

If the cost of an individual item is less than £500 its cost is written off at the time of purchase.

Depreciation is provided so as to write the cost of fixed assets down to their estimated residual value in equal annual instalments at the following rates:

(e) Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. The SOFA includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

(f) Fund accounting

Unrestricted general funds

The General funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects of the PCC at the discretion of the PCC. In practice, these are the funds we use for day to day expenditure. In addition, funds designated by the PCC for a particular purpose are also unrestricted.

Designated funds

In particular, allocations are made to the Fabric funds from time to time to provide for the cost of the major repairs revealed by QuinQuennial Inspections and to enable enhancements to or These comprise income which the PCC has resolved should be transferred from the General fund together with interest on the investments in which these funds are invested. replacement of consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Restricted funds

These funds, which arise from grants or donations made for a specific purpose, can only be used for that particular purpose within the objects of the PCC. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or grantor or where funds are raised for a particular publicised purpose. Where monies are received towards expenditure on tangible fixed assets then the depreciation applicable to that proportion of the expenditure financed by the restricted fund is charged against that fund.

Endowment funds

These comprise:

- (i) the following funds the capital of which cannot be spent:
- (a) the Fabric Endowment funds which were created by the dissolution of The Tibberton and Oddingley Church Buildings Trust and the distribution of its assets;
- (b) the Oddingley Churchyard Endowment Fund, set up by an anonymous donor with an initial capital of £40,000, the income from which is to pay for the upkeep of Oddingley churchyard; and
- (ii) the ex Hall proceeds which can be spent for the ecclesiastial purposes of the parish.
