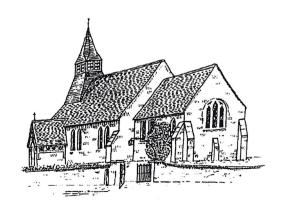

3. Constitutional matters

The parish is in the Pershore & Evesham Deanery in the Diocese of Worcester, and together with five other parishes constitutes the Bowbrook Group. There are two churches, St James, Church Lane, Oddingley, Droitwich Spa, WR9 7NE and St Peter ad Vincula, Church Lane, Tibberton, Droitwich Spa, WR9 7NW. The PCC is a charity but is currently excepted from registration with the Charity Commission because its annual income is less than £100,000. Members of the PCC are management trustees as defined by the Charities Act 2011. This Act and the associated regulations, The Church Accounting Regulations 2006 and The Charities (Accounts and Reports) Regulations 2008 (together "Regulations"), require the PCC to prepare accounts to 31 December each year which give a true and fair view of the financial position at the end of the financial year and of the financial activities for the year. The PCC is of the opinion that in preparing the accounts to 31 December 2021 appropriate accounting policies have been consistently applied, supported by reasonable and prudent estimates and judgements and all applicable accounting standards have been followed. The PCC is also satisfied that it has adequate resources to meet its needs for the foreseeable future and accordingly it continues to adopt the "going concern" basis in preparing the accounts.

The PCC is also responsible for ensuring that accounting records are kept which disclose, with reasonable accuracy at any time, the financial position of the PCC and which enable it to ensure that the accounts comply with the Charities Act and Regulations. It is also responsible for safeguarding the assets of the parish and hence for taking reasonable steps for the prevention and detection of fraud and other irregularities.

Members of the PCC are elected at the Annual Parochial Church Meeting in accordance with the Church Representation Rules as contained in Schedule 3 of the Synodical Government Measure 1969 (as amended).

All members on the church electoral roll are entitled to vote and to stand for election to the PCC. Additional members can be co-opted and the incumbent is ex-officio a member. The functions and powers of the PCC are contained in the Parochial Church Council (Powers) Measure 1956 as amended by the 1969 Measure. The PCC, as a legal minimum, is responsible for:

- A the financial management of the parish
- A the care and maintenance of the churches' fabric and churchyards
- A the appointment of trustees to any separate trusts connected with the parish.

So that they can discharge these responsibilities power has been conferred on the PCC to enable it, if appropriate, to:

- A acquire, manage and administer property for ecclesiastical purposes affecting the parish
- A formulate and approve an annual budget for the maintenance of the churches' work
- ▲ levy and collect a voluntary church rate
- make representations to the Bishop with regard to matters affecting the welfare of the parish and its inhabitants.

The Standing Committee is the only committee of the PCC required by law. It has the power to transact the business of the PCC between its meetings, subject to any directions given by the PCC.

ANNUAL REPORT - 2021

1. Objectives and Activities

Our purpose is the manifestation of our shared christian faith characterised by:

- services of public worship
- A maintaining a relevant and viable church
- A a programme of social events
- welcoming and supporting those coming to us for Baptisms, Marriages and Funerals
- A keeping our churches always open for private solitude, prayer and relaxation
- A engaging with the local community
- working within the Bowbrook Group and the wider Church
- A giving financial and other support to carefully selected charities.

The church is important to people living in the area and seeks to serve the community. Details of church activities can be found in the Bowbrook News magazine, on the churches' websites, (www.oddingleychurch.org and www.tibbertonchurch.org), on church and village notice boards and are distributed by email.

2. Achievements and Performance

The two churches continue to be managed largely by their Local Church Councils (LCC's) subject to supervision by the PCC.

The PCC has complied with the duty under section 5 of the Safeguarding and Clergy Discipline Measure 2016 i.e. the duty to have due regard to the House of Bishops' guidance on safeguarding children and vulnerable adults.

The PCC continues to meet quarterly. During 2021 meetings of the PCC began to return to something approaching normality, in that fewer of the meetings were online and more could take place in person. With the previous year's APCM not taking place until November 2020 due to the pandemic, the 2021 APCM took place again later than usual, on 4th August 2021. Lynne Morton was re-elected as Secretary and John Gearey as Treasurer, with Tobias Thornes elected to remain as chairperson.

In early 2021 the pandemic restrictions meant that services continued to be limited, with occasional Bowbrook Group services taking place at Tibberton or Oddingley and worship also being offered online every Sunday. This changed in July, when the normal pattern of services resumed weekly at both churches, in line with the rest of the Bowbrook Group. Online services were then discontinued. There have been changes regarding the ministerial team, with John Spencer and Peter Charlesworth retiring from their lay preacher roles at Tibberton and Oddingley respectively, and William Sumner joining Oddingley in the autumn to lead Evensong.

Information has continued to be shared with the parish through weekly email notices, as well as through the printed Bowbrook News. PCC meetings have been held at a variety of locations due to the parish agreeing to cancel its decades-old agreement to have the use of Tibberton Parish Hall for meetings. This will enable the old hall to change to a different use and a new Parish Hall to be inaugurated, but the latter is not yet open. The PCC has endeavoured to cooperate with the Parish Council and Hall Management Committee as much as possible to avoid incurring delays to the project.

In terms of social events, Oddingley lacked the capacity to hold any of these, especially given the pandemic and its potential impact on more vulnerable members of the congregation. However, Tibberton held regular drop-ins and other social events through the year. Parish finances remained healthy overall, but the number of people attending services remained low compared to pre-pandemic levels.

Reports from the LCCs on the individual churches are as follows:-

St Peter ad Vincula, Tibberton 2021

The Covid pandemic continued to affect the Church and its activities through 2021. Zoom services and online prayers were very helpful. The church opened for services when restrictions lifted, with changes made to the usual format in order to comply with Government restrictions and to keep the congregation safe. Attendance was down on pre-pandemic levels with an average of 15 in the congregation. It is quite understandable that some people continue to be nervous about attending. Christmas services were held with a Christingle service, a Children's Carol Service, Nine lessons and Carols and a Christmas Day service.

Covid restrictions also affected fundraising events but the Christmas Raffle went ahead and grossed £821. Mark Wassall and Linda and Graham Warren were all very involved with the raffle and responsible for its success. The return of the monthly coffee mornings was also welcome, bringing friends together while raising funds.

The wedding, in September of Steff Grimer and Tom Bryant was a joyful occasion and the worn bell ropes were replaced just in time to ring on the day.

Richard and Justine Barrett moved to the village and Richard has become a valued member of the ministry team, taking a service each month.

The school continued to enjoy a close relationship with the Church, the Christian ethos being apparent in the running of the school. The SIAMS inspection report classed the school as outstanding, this reflecting the influence of the Church. The Open The Book team resumed their visits which the children very much enjoy. There was a school Rogation Service and a very successful Isingpop concert in the church.

The Quinquenial Inspection was carried out by the architect in June, the results of which indicated that there are a number of areas which need attention. Graham Warren met with the architect and subsequently with a builder to discuss the best course of action. It is planned that two windows which have come away from the brickwork, should be repaired in summer 2022. Further repairs will be done at a later date.

Esther Crossley ensured that throughout the year there were fresh flowers in the church.

The organ was tuned in late summer and it was reported to be in good condition.

The churchyard was kept beautifully though the year, by Trace and Steve Randall. It was awarded third prize in the best kept churchyard competition, being visited by judges three times between April and August.

Services and Ministry

2021 began with continuing restrictions due to the Covid pandemic. The Church was closed except for private prayer between 10.00 am and 3.00 pm on Sundays. Great care was taken to minimise any risk of infection, with hand sanitiser provided, social distancing required and Track and Trace details collected in line with Government guidance. Eventually we were able to open the church in May and began to hold some services again, still with social distancing etc.

Peter Charlesworth, who had been with us for many years taking regular services, decided that the time had come to retire and we sadly said "goodbye" to him on September 19th but we were fortunately able to welcome a new Reader, Bill Sumner, in October. We are grateful that he is happy to take Evensong on the 3rd Sunday each month and he led our Service of Nine Lessons and Carols on 19th December. By the end of the year we had settled in to a monthly pattern of services much like we had before the pandemic with David

Morris taking Holy Communion on the 1st Sunday and Toby Thornes leading Matins on 2nd and 4th Sundays. We are very grateful for their ministry.

We have been pleased to have Des George to play the organ for most of our services; even during the times we were not allowed to sing!

Special services during the year were:

- 2nd April An Hour by the Cross
- 7th July Funeral of Sheila Talbot
- 3rd October Harvest Communion
- 22nd October Interment of Ashes of Lyn Johnson
- 19th December Carol Service

Fabric and Maintenance

- The fire extinguishers were checked in April.
- The architect's Quinquennial Inspection was carried out on 20th May. When the report was received it contained no urgent repairs required but there are a few issues that need to be investigated and these will be addressed as soon as possible.
- The organ was inspected and tuned on 6th October and given a "clean bill of health".
- The bell tower was cleaned and window guards repaired and replaced on 29th October.
- Mark Regan, the Diocesan Bell adviser, inspected the bells on 26th November. He was accompanied
 by two others with an interest in church bells. All was found to be in good order and we were
 advised to ring the bells regularly. A full report was promised. We started ranging the bells before
 services on 28th November.
- The hedge on the south boundary of the churchyard has been trimmed and the churchyard has been regularly mown and tidied.

The usual rota of volunteers' duties has not been in place but all necessary cleaning and maintenance has still been carried out in the church and churchyard.

Social events and Fundraising

During the pandemic these have been curtailed. The church was left open for the "Ride and Stride" sponsored event in September with refreshments left for participants, but on a smaller scale than in previous years and not "manned". Jumble Sales and Drop-ins are on hold until the pandemic is over.

3. Electoral roll and usual Sunday attendance

The number on the electoral roll reported to the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on 4th August 2021 was 60, a decrease of 4.

4. Finance

Our finances for 2021 contain two large numbers which have absolutely nothing to do directly with our purpose and mission, our worship or our outreach activities. One, which was the result of circumstances completely outwith our control, is the appreciation, between January and December, of £65,000 in the value of our investments. This appreciation is not 'money in the bank' until such time as we sell those investments; and of course, by then the value may well have gone down again. Indeed, as a result of world events since December 2021, and particularly the war in Ukraine, the investments have lost about 50% of that appreciation. Nevertheless, the gain is still substantial.

The second large unusual item concerns the money we received from the sale of the Church Hall and School House in January 2016, which we 'ring-fenced'. You will recall we gave an undertaking to the Diocese that the proceeds would not be spent meeting day-to-day bills, but used to enhance the facilities of the church and its activities. What this could cover was not specifically defined but we indicated the sort of things we had in mind .e.g. a water supply to Oddingley church, toilets and perhaps a kitchen. We also considered that major refurbishment costs to maintain the building and its equipment could 'qualify', so used some of the money to completely overhaul the organ and to have the church rewired. The remainder has been invested until such time as progress on the original objectives can be made. During this time those investments have generated £128,000 in income and appreciation, far more than inflation over the same period, so, after discussion by the PCC the view was taken that provided the money ring-fenced was 'index-linked' to keep pace with inflation, any excess could properly be used for general purposes. This freed up £92,000.

Looking at our normal income and expenditure, it followed the pattern of 2021, viz a reduced number of services, hesitancy by a number of our congregation to return to worship, no weddings and the loss of a number of stalwarts following illness. Despite these factors, voluntary income was virtually unchanged, a fall in Oddingley as there was no repeat of the legacy received in the previous year, offset by an increase in Tibberton in gift aid and collections. As in 2020, fund raising was an incidental item as a result of the pandemic and yielded £600 less than in 2020, whilst investment income on general funds dropped following a reduction in the interest rate paid on savings. Both churches' shares of Bowbrook News income from sales and advertising fell – in total by £1,250 – and the fees from funerals brought in £2,400, the same as in 2020. The result was a fall in general purposes income of £2,000.

At the same time, expenditure increased by £9,000 as a result of decisions to use reserves (i) to pay parish share in full, and (ii) to make a special donation to Droitwich Food Bank. We also repeated the donation of £7,500 to the Diocesan Ministry Fund that we had made the previous year.

So, before the transfer of £92,000 referred to earlier, we spent £11,000 more than in 2020, and ended with a deficit of £26,000. That pattern obviously cannot continue indefinitely, and we need to be mindful that in the long term the church relies on its members' generosity to ensure the bills are paid, the fabic maintained and the witness continued. However, until we see what the 'new normal' looks like we are in the fortunate position that we can afford to use our reserves to 'balance the books', providing we do so responsibly. Our strong financial position may mean we should help the other churches in the Bowbrook Group transition to the new basis of allocating Ministry Share.

Both churches have a (restricted) Fabric fund – the former Church Buildings Trust – the income on which cover most of our routine repairs and maintenance expenditure. The funds had an income from their investments of £4,000 and spent £4,400. The investment appreciated by £400, so the Fabric Funds came out all square.

We also have four endowment funds; two being that portion of the former Church Buildings Trust that has to remain invested to produce an income, one being a lump sum donated to Oddingley some years ago, to provide an income to maintain the churchyard and the other being the proceeds from the sale of the Church Hall and School House. The income from the first three of these goes into the Restricted funds (see above) where the expenditure is made. The income on the fourth was just under £9,000, which has been kept in the fund. This is the fund from which the £92,000, referred to previously was released.

Reserves

The PCC considers it prudent to have reserves equivalent to six months' expenditure plus, this year, the estimated amount required to carry out the maintenance advised in the Quinquennial Inspection Reports (QI) and a margin of £5,000. i.e.£90,000. Our free reserves amounted to £160,800 and we have a further £16,172 in Fabric Funds which can be used for the QI repairs, so we have adequate reserves.

6. Conclusion

This has been, like 2020 before it, a very unusual year. We have lost much-loved friends during the pandemic, whilst others have moved away or seen patterns of life change such that they are no longer regular congreagants. Throughout 2021 we adhered to government and Church of England guidance, and saw patterns of worship shift around to reflect the needs and requirements of the changing situation. Thankfully, in the latter half of the year the danger posed by Covid-19 began to abate and worship was able to return to a semblance of normality. Some subtle alterations have been made relative to pre-pandemic times, and lay ministers have left and joined us. We are hopeful that the worship offered at both Tibberton and Oddingley is as accessible and inviting as we can make it given the resources that we have, now that variety and regularity of services has returned.

Our vision for the parish includes the aspiration to be a 'relevant and viable Church' within the communities which we serve. The pandemic has presented challenges for us, but also opportunities, and it remains our hope that we will be able to make the most of these opportunities to engage more people with the Church and its message of hope. Our social events calendar remains depleted but is beginning to recover, and our churches have remained popular locations for funerals and weddings. As the figures recorded in this report will attest, unlike many churches our main obstacles are not presently financial; rather, amidst the reality of dwindling congregations and seemingly fewer people able to join our rotas, we pray for the people power needed to make God's love known in this rural corner of creation.

We remain steadfast in our conviction that God is with us in all the twists and turns of life, and maintain our faith in Him to guide us through the coming year.

Independent examiner's report to the trustees of Hadzor with Oddingley and Tibberton Parochial Church Council (PCC)

I report to the trustees on my examination of the accounts of the Hadzor with Oddingley and Tibberton Parochial Church Council (the Trust) for the year ended 31 December 2021 set out on pages 9 to 32.

Responsibilities and basis of report

As the charity's trustees you are responsible for the preparation of the accounts in accordance with the requirements of the Charities Act 2011 (the Act).

I report in respect of my examination of the Trust's accounts carried out under section 145 of the 2011 Act and in carrying out my examination I have followed all the applicable Directions given by the Charity Commission under section 145(5)(b) of the Act. An examination includes a review of the accounting records kept by the charity and a comparison of the accounts presented with those records. It also includes consideration of any unusual items or disclosures in the accounts, and seeking explanations from you as trustees concerning any such matters. The procedures undertaken do not provide all the evidence that would be required in an audit and consequently no opinion is given as to whether the accounts present a 'true and fair view' and the report is limited to those matters set out in the statement below.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS - 31 December 2021

1 Accounting policies

(a) Basis of preparation

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Charities Act 2011 and the Church Accounting Regulations 2006, together with applicable accounting standards and with the Charities SORP (FRS 102), under the historical cost convention, with the exception of investments which are included at market value, using the accruals basis; that is, with the exception noted in (b) below, income and expenditure is brought into account in the period to which it relates which is not necessarily the same period in which it is received or paid.

In order to give a complete picture of the affairs of the parish these accounts include the transactions, assets and liabilities representing our share of Bowbrook Group and Bowbrook News.

(b) Income

With the exception of gift aid tax recoverable, which is accrued, income is only brought into account when it is received and recorded or legal title exists. For fund raising events the proceeds are accounted for gross with any associated costs being shown separately (if material).

(c) Missionary and charitable giving

Donations are made to other charities of a percentage of the gross income of the General fund and they are accounted for at the earlier of the time of payment or when awarded.

(d) Tangible fixed assets

Consecrated property and movable church furnishings

Consecrated and beneficed property of any kind is excluded from the accounts by sections 10 (2) (a) and (c) of the Charities Act 2011.

property unless consecrated. They are listed in the church's Inventory which can be inspected (at any reasonable time). For inalienable property acquired prior to 1 January Movable church furnishings held by the Vicar and Churchwardens on special trust for the PCC, and which require a faculty for their disposal, are accounted as inalienable 2000 there is insufficient cost information available and therefore, such assets are not valued in the financial statements. Items acquired since 1 January 2000 and costing more than £1,000 are capitalised.

Other land and buildings, fixtures, fittings and equipment

If the cost of an individual item is less than £500 its cost is written off at the time of purchase.

Depreciation is provided so as to write the cost of fixed assets down to their estimated residual value in equal annual instalments at the following rates:

(e) Investments

Fixed asset investments are stated at market value at the balance sheet date. The SOFA includes the net gains and losses arising on revaluations and disposals throughout the year.

(f) Fund accounting

Unrestricted general funds

The General funds can be used in accordance with the charitable objects of the PCC at the discretion of the PCC. In practice, these are the funds we use for day to day expenditure. In addition, funds designated by the PCC for a particular purpose are also unrestricted.

Designated funds

In particular, allocations are made to the Fabric funds from time to time to provide for the cost of the major repairs revealed by QuinQuennial Inspections and to enable enhancements to or These comprise income which the PCC has resolved should be transferred from the General fund together with interest on the investments in which these funds are invested. replacement of consecrated land and buildings and movable church furnishings.

Restricted funds

These funds, which arise from grants or donations made for a specific purpose, can only be used for that particular purpose within the objects of the PCC. Restrictions arise when specified by the donor or grantor or where funds are raised for a particular publicised purpose. Where monies are received towards expenditure on tangible fixed assets then the depreciation applicable to that proportion of the expenditure financed by the restricted fund is charged against that fund.

Endowment funds

These comprise:

- (i) the following funds the capital of which cannot be spent:
- (a) the Fabric Endowment funds which were created by the dissolution of The Tibberton and Oddingley Church Buildings Trust and the distribution of its assets;
- (b) the Oddingley Churchyard Endowment Fund, set up by an anonymous donor with an initial capital of £40,000, the income from which is to pay for the upkeep of Oddingley churchyard; and
- (ii) the ex Hall proceeds which can be spent for the ecclesiastial purposes of the parish.
